Item 1.01. Entry into a Material Definitive Agreement.

Underwriting Agreement

On March 13, 2014, MicroVision, Inc. (the "Company") entered into an underwriting agreement (the "Underwriting Agreement") with Oppenheimer & Co. Inc. (the "Underwriter"). The Underwriting Agreement provides for the sale of (i) an aggregate of 7,160,000 shares ("Shares") of common stock, par value \$0.001 per share ("Common Stock"), and (ii) warrants to purchase an aggregate of 2,148,000 shares of Common Stock (the "Warrants"). The shares of Common Stock and Warrants are being sold as units ("Units"), with each Unit consisting of one Share and one Warrant to purchase 0.3 shares of Common Stock, at a public offering price of \$1.94 per Unit, less the underwriting discounts and commissions payable by the Company (the "Offering"). The Underwriter will purchase the Units at a discounted price of \$1.8236 per Unit. The transactions contemplated by the Underwriting Agreement are expected to close on March 18, 2014, subject to the satisfaction of customary closing conditions. The Shares and the Warrants are being offered and sold pursuant to the Company's registration statements on Form S-3 (Registration Nos. 333-192864 and 333-184703 and the Registration Statement filed on March 13, 2014 pursuant to Rule 462(b) under the Securities Act of 1933 relating thereto).

Warrant Agreement

Upon closing of the Offering, the Company will enter into a warrant agreement (the "Warrant Agreement") pursuant to which the Warrants will be issued at an exercise price equal to \$2.47 per share. The warrants will be exercisable at any time beginning six months from the date of issuance and until the five-year anniversary of the date of initial issuance. The warrants may be exercised by surrendering to the warrant agent the warrant certificate evidencing the warrants to be exercised with the accompanying exercise notice, appropriately completed, duly signed and delivered, together with cash payment of the exercise price, if applicable.

In the event of an extraordinary transaction, as described in the warrants and generally including any merger with or into another entity, sale of all or substantially all of our assets, tender offer or exchange offer, or reclassification of our common stock, in which the amount of the alternate consideration is less than the exercise price of the warrant, then we or any successor entity shall pay at the holder's option, exercisable at any time concurrently with or within thirty (30) days after the consummation of the fundamental transaction, an amount of cash equal to the value of the warrant as determined in accordance with the Black Scholes option pricing model.

Upon surrender of the warrant certificate, with the exercise notice appropriately completed and duly signed and cash payment of the exercise price, if applicable, on and subject to the terms and conditions of the warrant agreement, we will deliver or cause to be delivered, to or upon the written order of such holder, the number of whole shares of common stock to which the holder is entitled, which shares may be delivered in book-entry form. If fewer than all of the warrants evidenced by a warrant certificate are to be exercised, a new warrant certificate will be issued for the remaining number of warrants.

If, and only if, a registration statement relating to the issuance of the shares underlying the warrants is not then effective or available, a holder of warrants would only be entitled to exercise the warrants on a cashless basis, where the holder receives the net value of the warrant in shares of common stock. Holders of warrants also will be able to exercise their warrants only if the shares of common stock underlying the warrant are qualified for sale or are at the time exempt from qualification under the applicable securities or blue sky laws of the states in which such holder (or other persons to whom it is proposed that shares be issued on exercise of the warrants) reside. Shares issued pursuant to a cashless exercise would be freely tradable without restriction or further registration under the Securities Act of 1933, as amended (the "Securities Act") by persons other than our affiliates (within the meaning of Rule 144 under the Securities Act).

The exercise price and the number and type of securities purchasable upon exercise of warrants are subject to adjustment upon certain corporate events, including certain combinations, consolidations, liquidations, mergers, recapitalizations, reclassifications, reorganizations, stock dividends and stock splits, a sale of all or substantially all of our assets and certain other events.

No fractional shares will be issued upon exercise of the warrants. The warrants do not confer upon holders any voting or other rights as stockholders of the Company.

A copy of the opinion of Ropes & Gray LLP relating to the legality of the issuance and sale of the securities in the Offering is attached as Exhibit 5.1 hereto. Copies of the Underwriting Agreement and the Warrant Agreement are filed herewith as Exhibits 1.1 and 4.1, respectively, and are incorporated herein by reference. The foregoing description of the Offering by the Company and the documentation related thereto does not purport to be complete and is qualified in its entirety by reference to such exhibits.

Ladies and Gentlemen:

MicroVision, Inc., a Delaware corporation (the "Company"), proposes, subject to the terms and conditions contained herein, to sell to you, as the underwriter (the "Underwriter"), an aggregate of (i) 7,160,000 shares (the "Shares") of the Company's common stock, \$0.001 par value per share (the "Common Stock") and (ii) warrants to purchase 2,148,000 shares of Common Stock (the "Warrants", and together with the Shares, the "Securities"). The shares of Common Stock underlying the Warrants are referred to herein as the "Warrant Shares."

The Company has prepared and filed in conformity with the requirements of the Securities Act of 1933, as amended (the 'Securities Act'), and the published rules and regulations thereunder (the "Rules") adopted by the Securities and Exchange Commission (the 'Commission") (i) a Registration Statement on Form S-3 (No. 333-184703) (the "First Registration Statement") and (ii) a Registration Statement on Form S-3 (No. 333-192864) (the 'Second Registration Statement'), and such amendments thereof to the date of this Agreement. Copies of each such Registration Statement (including all amendments thereof) and of the related Preliminary Prospectus (as hereinafter defined) have heretofore been delivered by the Company to you. The term "Preliminary Prospectus" means any preliminary prospectus included at any time as a part of each such Registration Statement (including all exhibits, financial schedules and all documents and information deemed to be a part of the First Registration Statement and the Second Registration Statement to Rule 424(a) of the Rules. If the Commission pursuant to Rule 424(b) of the Rules and alberviated registration statement to register additional Securities pursuant to Rule 462(b) under the Rules (each a "462(b) Registration Statement"), then any reference herein to the Registration statement to register

Statements shall also be deemed to include any such 462(b) Registration Statement. The term "*Prospectus*" as used in this Agreement means the prospectus in the form included in each such Registration Statement at the time of effectiveness or, if Rule 430A of the Rules is relied on, the term Prospectus shall also include the final prospectus filed with the Commission pursuant to and within the time limits described in Rule 424(b) of the Rules. Reference made herein to any Preliminary Prospectus, the Statutory Prospectus (as hereinafter defined) or to the Prospectus shall be deemed to refer to and include any documents incorporated by reference therein, including pursuant to Item 12 of Form S-3 under the Securities Act, as of the date of such Preliminary Prospectus, shall be deemed to refer to and include any document or supplement to any Preliminary Prospectus or the Prospectus shall be deemed to refer to and include any document filed under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended (the "*Exchange Act*"), after the date of such Preliminary Prospectus or the Prospectus, as the case may be, and incorporated by reference in such Preliminary Prospectus or the Prospectus, as the case may be, and incorporated by reference in such Preliminary Prospectus or the Prospectus, as the case may be, and incorporated by reference in such Preliminary Prospectus or the Prospectus, as the case may be, and incorporated by reference in such Preliminary Prospectus or the Prospectus, as the case may be, and incorporated by reference in such Preliminary Prospectus or the Prospectus, as the case may be.

The Company understands that the Underwriter proposes to make a public offering of the Securities, as set forth in and pursuant to the Statutory Prospectus (as hereinafter defined) and the Prospectus, as soon after the date of this Agreement as the Underwriter deems advisable. The Company hereby confirms that the Underwriter and dealers have been authorized to distribute or cause to be distributed each Preliminary Prospectus, and each Issuer Free Writing Prospectus (as hereinafter defined) and are authorized to distribute the Prospectus (as from time to time amended or supplemented if the Company furnishes amendments or supplements thereto to the Underwriter).

1. Sale, Purchase, Delivery and Payment for the Securities On the basis of the representations, warranties and agreements contained in, and subject to the terms and conditions of, this Agreement:

(a) The Company agrees to issue and sell to the Underwriter, and the Underwriter agrees to purchase from the Company, at a purchase price of \$1.8236 per unit (each unit composed of one Share and one Warrant), the Securities.

(b) Payment of the purchase price for, and delivery of certificates for, the Securities shall be made at the offices of Oppenheimer & Co. Inc., 85 Broad Street, New York, NY 10004, at 10:00 a.m., New York City time, on the third business day following the date of this Agreement or at such time on such other date, not later than ten (10) business days after the date of this Agreement, as shall be agreed upon by the Company and the Underwriter (such time and date of delivery and payment is called the *"Closing Date"*).

(c) Payment shall be made to the Company by wire transfer of immediately available funds against delivery of the respective certificates to the Underwriter.

(e) The Securities shall be registered in such names and shall be in such denominations as the Underwriter shall request at least two full business days before the Closing Date and shall be delivered by or on behalf of the Company to the Underwriter through the facilities of the Depository Trust Company ("**DTC**") for the account of the Underwriter. The Company will cause the certificates representing the Securities to be made available for checking and packaging, at such place as is designated by the Underwriter, on the full business day before the Closing Date.

2. Representations and Warranties of the Company.

(a) The Company represents and warrants to the Underwriter, as of the date hereof, as follows:

(i) *Preliminary Prospectus*. No order preventing or suspending the use of any Preliminary Prospectus has been issued by the Commission, and each Preliminary Prospectus, at the time of filing or the time of first use within the meaning of the Rules, conformed in all material respects to the requirements of the Securities Act and the Rules, and did not contain an untrue statement of a material fact or omit to state a material fact required to be stated therein or necessary to make the statements therein, in the light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading; except that the foregoing shall not apply to statements in or omissions from any Preliminary Prospectus made in reliance upon, and in conformity with, information relating to the Underwriter furnished in writing to the Company by the Underwriter, expressly for use in the preparation thereof, which information the parties hereto agree is limited to the statements made in the second and seventh paragraphs under the caption "Underwriting" in the Prospectus (collectively, the "*Underwriter Information*").

(ii) *Registration Statement*. The First Registration Statement, the Second Registration Statement, any Rule 462(b) Registration Statement and any posteffective amendment thereto have been declared effective by the Commission under the Securities Act or have become effective pursuant to Rule 462 under the Rules. The Company has responded to all requests, if any, of the Commission for additional or supplemental information. No stop order suspending the effectiveness of the Registration Statements or any Rule 462(b) Registration Statement is in effect and no proceedings for such purpose have been instituted or are pending or, to the knowledge of the Company, are contemplated or threatened by the Commission.

(iii) Compliance with Securities Act Requirements Each of the Registration Statements, any Rule 462(b) Registration Statement and any post-effective amendment thereto, at the time it became effective (including each deemed Effective Time), at all other subsequent times until the Closing Date, conformed and will conform in all material respects with the applicable requirements and provisions of the Securities Act, the Rules and the Exchange Act, and did not and will not contain an untrue statement of a material fact or omit to state a material fact required to be stated therein or necessary to make the statements therein not misleading; except that the foregoing shall not apply to statements in or omissions from the Registration Statements, any Rule 462(b) Registration Statement, or any post-effective amendment thereto, or any amendments or supplements thereto, made in reliance upon, and in conformity with, information relating to the Underwriter furnished in writing to the Company by the Underwriter, expressly for use in the preparation thereof, which information the parties hereto agree is limited to the Underwriter Information.

(iv) Contents of Prospectus. The Prospectus, as amended or supplemented, as of its date, and the time of first use within the meaning of the Rules, at all subsequent times until the Closing Date, conformed and will conform in all material respects with the applicable requirements and provisions of the Securities Act and the Rules and did not and will not contain any untrue statement of a material fact or omit to state a material fact necessary in order to make the statements therein, in the light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading; except that the foregoing shall not apply to statements in or omissions from the Prospectus, or any amendments or supplements thereto, made in reliance upon, and in conformity with, information relating to the Underwriter furnished in writing to the Company by the Underwriter, expressly for use in the preparation thereof, which information the parties hereto agree is limited to the Underwriter Information.

(v) *Incorporated Documents*. Each of the documents incorporated by reference in the Registration Statements, the General Disclosure Package and the Prospectus, when they became effective or were filed with the Commission, as the case may be, complied in all material respects with the requirements of the Securities Act or the Exchange Act, as applicable, and did not contain an untrue statement of a material fact or omit to state a material fact in order to make the statements therein, in the light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading.

(vi) *Not an Ineligible Issuer*. (1) At the earliest time after the filing of the First Registration Statement that the Company or another offering participant made a *bona fide* offer (within the meaning of Rule 164(h)(2) under the Securities Act) of the Securities and (2) as of the date hereof, the Company was not and is not an "ineligible issuer," as defined in Rule 405 under the Securities Act, including the Company or any Subsidiary in the preceding three years not having been convicted of a felony or misdemeanor or having been made the subject of a judicial or administrative decree or order as described in Rule 405 (without taking account of any determination by the Commission pursuant to Rule 405 that it is not necessary that the Company be considered an ineligible issuer), nor an "excluded issuer" as defined in Rule 164 under the Securities Act.

(vii) General Disclosure Package. As of the Applicable Time (as defined below), neither (A) the Issuer General Free Writing Prospectus(es) (as defined below) issued at or prior to the Applicable Time, the Statutory Prospectus (as defined below) and the information included on <u>Schedule I</u> hereto, all considered together (collectively, the "General Disclosure Package"), nor (B) any individual Issuer Limited-Use Free Writing Prospectus (as defined below), when considered together with the General Disclosure Package, includes or included as of the Applicable Time any untrue statement of a material fact or omits or omitted as of the Applicable Time to state any material fact necessary in order to make the statements therein, in the light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading. The preceding sentence does not apply to statements in or omissions from any Statutory Prospectus included in the Registration Statements or any Issuer Free Writing Prospectus based upon and in conformity with written information furnished to the Company by the Underwriter specifically for use therein, which information the parties hereto agree is limited to the Underwriter Information. As used in this paragraph and elsewhere in this Agreement:

(1) "Applicable Time" means 8:30 a.m. (New York City time) on the date of this Agreement or such other time as agreed to by the Company and the Underwriter.

(2) "*Statutory Prospectus*" means the Preliminary Prospectus, if any, and the base prospectus from each of the First Registration Statement and the Second Registration Statement relating to the Securities included as part of the Registration Statements, as amended and supplemented immediately prior to the Applicable Time, including any document incorporated by reference therein and any prospectus supplement deemed to be a part thereof. For purposes of this definition, information contained in a form of prospectus that is deemed retroactively to be a part of the Registration Statements pursuant to Rule 430B under the Securities Act shall be considered to be included in the Statutory Prospectus as of the actual time that form of prospectus is filed with the Commission pursuant to Rule 424(b) under the Securities Act.

(3) "*Issuer Free Writing Prospectus*" means any "issuer free writing prospectus," as defined in Rule 433 under the Securities Act, relating to the Securities, including any electronic road show, that (A) is required to be filed with the Commission by the Company or (B) is exempt from filing pursuant to Rule 433(d)(5)(i) under the Securities Act because it contains a description of the Securities or of the offering that does not reflect the final terms, in each case in the form filed or required to be filed with the Commission or, if not required to be filed, in the form retained in the Company's records pursuant to Rule 433(g) under the Securities Act.

(4) "Issuer General Free Writing Prospectus" means any Issuer Free Writing Prospectus that is intended for general distribution to prospective investors, as evidenced by its being specified in <u>Schedule II</u> hereto.

(5) "Issuer Limited-Use Free Writing Prospectus" means any Issuer Free Writing Prospectus that is not an Issuer General Free Writing Prospectus.

(viii) Conflict with the Registration Statements. Each Issuer Free Writing Prospectus, as of its issue date and at all subsequent times through the Closing Date or until any earlier date that the Company notified or notifies the Underwriter as described in Section 4(a)(iv), did not, does not and will not include any information that conflicted, conflicts or will conflict with the information contained in the Registration Statements, any Statutory Prospectus or the Prospectus.

(ix) Free Writing Prospectuses. Each Issuer Free Writing Prospectus satisfied, as of its issue date and at all subsequent times through the Closing Date, all other conditions to use thereof as set forth in Rules 164 and 433 under the Securities Act.

(x) Distributed Materials. The Company has not distributed and will not distribute any prospectus or other offering material in connection with the offering other than any Preliminary Prospectus, the General Disclosure Package or the Prospectus or other materials, if any, permitted under the Securities Act to be distributed by the Company; provided, however, that, except as set forth on <u>Schedule II</u>, the Company has not made and will not make any offer relating to the Securities that would constitute a "free writing prospectus" as defined in Rule 405 under the Securities Act, except in accordance with the provisions of <u>Section 4(f)</u> of this Agreement.

(xi) *Financial Statements*. The financial statements of the Company, together with the related notes, set forth or incorporated by reference in the Registration Statements, the General Disclosure Package and the Prospectus comply in all material respects with the requirements of the Securities Act and the Exchange Act and fairly present, in all material respects, the financial condition of the Company as of the dates indicated and the results of operations and changes in cash flows for the periods therein specified in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles consistently applied throughout the periods involved (in the case of unaudited interim financial statements, subject to normal year-end adjustments); and the supporting schedules included in the Registration Statements present fairly, in all material respects, the information required to be stated therein. No other financial statements or schedules are required to be included in the Registration Statements, the General Disclosure Package or the Prospectus.

(xii) Independent Accountants. To the Company's knowledge, Moss Adams LLP (the "Auditor"), which has expressed its opinion with respect to the financial statements and schedules filed as a part of, or incorporated by reference in, the Registration Statements and included or incorporated by reference in the Registration Statements, the General Disclosure Package and the Prospectus and with regard to the Company's internal control over financing reporting and management's assessment thereof, is an independent public accounting firm within the meaning of the Securities Act and the Rules and such accountants are not in violation of the auditor independence requirements of the Sarbanes-Oxley Act of 2002 (the "Sarbanes-Oxley Act").

(xiii) Organization. Each of the Company and its Subsidiaries has been duly organized and is validly existing as a corporation in good standing under the laws of its jurisdiction of incorporation. Each of the Company and its Subsidiaries has full corporate power and authority to own its properties and to conduct its business as currently being conducted and as described in the Registration Statements, the General Disclosure Package and the Prospectus, and is duly qualified to do business as a foreign corporation in good standing in each other jurisdiction in which it owns or leases real property or in which the conduct of its business requires such qualification, except where the failure to be so qualified would not have a material adverse effect upon the business, prospects, properties, financial condition or results of operations of the Company and its Subsidiaries, taken as a whole ("Material Adverse Effect").

(xiv) Absence of Material Changes. Except as contemplated in the General Disclosure Package and in the Prospectus, subsequent to the respective dates as of which information is given in the General Disclosure Package, neither the Company nor any of its Subsidiaries has incurred any material liabilities or obligations, direct or contingent, or entered into any material transactions, or declared or paid any dividends or made any distribution of any kind with respect to its capital stock; and there has not been any change in the capital stock (other than a change permitted pursuant to this Agreement, including without limitation a change in the number of outstanding shares of Common Stock due to the issuance of shares upon the exercise of outstanding options or warrants), or any material change in the short-term or long-term debt, or any issuance of options, warrants, convertible securities or other rights to purchase the capital stock, of the Company or any of its Subsidiaries, taken as a whole ("Material Adverse Change").

(xv) Legal Proceedings. Except as set forth in the General Disclosure Package and in the Prospectus, there is not pending or, to the knowledge of the Company, threatened or contemplated, any action, suit or proceeding to which the Company or any of its Subsidiaries is a party or of which any property or assets of the Company is the subject before or by any court or governmental agency, authority or body, or any arbitrator, which, individually or in the aggregate, would reasonably be likely to result in a Material Adverse Change.

(xvi) Contracts. There are no statutes, regulations, contracts or documents that are required to be described in the Registration Statements, in the General Disclosure Package and in the Prospectus or be filed as exhibits to the Registration Statements by the Securities Act or by the Rules that have not been so described or filed.

(xvii) *Due Authorization and Enforceability*. The Company has full power and authority to enter into this Agreement and to authorize, issue and sell the Securities as contemplated by this Agreement. This Agreement has been duly authorized, executed and delivered by the Company, and constitutes a valid, legal and binding obligation of the Company, enforceable in accordance with its terms, except as rights to indemnity hereunder may be limited by federal or state securities laws and except as such enforceability may be limited by bankruptcy, insolvency, reorganization or similar laws affecting the rights of creditors generally and subject to general principles of equity. The Warrants have been duly and validly authorized, executed and delivered by the Company and will constitute legal, valid and binding obligations of the Company enforceable against the Company in accordance with their terms, except as the enforceability thereof may be limited by bankruptcy, insolvency, reorganization, receivership, liquidation, fraudulent conveyance, moratorium or other similar laws affecting the enforcement of creditors' rights generally and by general equitable principles. All necessary corporate action has been duly and validly taken by the Company to authorize the issuance and delivery of the Warrant Shares by the Company.

(xviii) No Conflict. The execution, delivery and performance of this Agreement and the Warrants and the consummation of the transactions therein contemplated, including the issuance and sale by the Company of the Securities and the Warrant Shares, will not result in a breach or violation of any of the terms and provisions



of, or constitute a default under, (a) any statute, (b) any agreement or instrument to which the Company is a party or by which it is bound or to which any of its property is subject, (c) the Company's charter or by-laws, or (d) any order, rule, regulation or decree of any court or governmental agency or body having jurisdiction over the Company or any of its properties, other than, with respect to clauses (a), (b) and (d) above, any conflict, breach, default or violation that would not have a Material Adverse Effect.

(xix) No Consents Required. Except for the registration of the Securities under the Securities Act and the Exchange Act, including as may be required with respect to the listing of the Shares and the Warrant Shares on the Nasdaq Global Market or as may be required under state securities or blue sky laws in connection with the offering or that would not have a Material Adverse Effect, no consent, approval, authorization or order of, or filing with, any court or governmental administrative or regulatory agency or body is required for the execution, delivery and performance of this Agreement and the Warrants or for the consummation of the transactions contemplated thereby, including the issuance and sale of the Shares and the Warrant Shares.

(xx) *Capitalization*. All of the issued and outstanding shares of capital stock of the Company, including the outstanding shares of Common Stock, are duly authorized and validly issued, fully paid and nonassessable, have been issued in compliance with all federal and state securities laws, were not issued in violation of or subject to any preemptive rights or other rights to subscribe for or purchase securities that have not been waived in writing (a copy of which has been delivered to counsel to the Underwriter) or satisfied, and the holders thereof are not subject to personal liability by reason of being such holders. The Company has an authorized and outstanding capitalization as set forth in the Registration Statements, in the General Disclosure Package and in the Prospectus. The capital stock of the Company has reserved and kept available for the exercise of the Warrants such number of authorized but unissued shares as are sufficient to permit the exercise in full of the Warrants. All of the issued and outstanding shares of capital stock of each of the Company's Subsidiaries have been duly and validly authorized and issued and are fully paid and refully paid and possessable, and, except as otherwise described in the Registration Statements, in the General Disclosure Package and in the Prospectus and except for any directors' qualifying shares, the Company owns of record and beneficially, free and clear of any security interests, claims, liens, proxies, equities or other encumbrances, all of the issued and outstanding shares of such stock.

(xxi) *The Securities.* The Shares, when delivered by the Company pursuant to this Agreement, and the Warrant Shares, upon exercise of the Warrants, have been duly authorized and, when issued, delivered and paid for in accordance with the terms of this Agreement, will have been validly issued and will be fully paid and nonassessable.

(xxii) Preemptive Rights. Except as otherwise stated in the Registration Statements, in the General Disclosure Package and in the Prospectus, there are no statutory or contractual preemptive rights or other rights to subscribe for or to purchase,

or any restriction upon the voting or transfer of, any Securities pursuant to the Company's charter, by-laws or any agreement or other instrument to which the Company is a party or by which the Company is bound.

(xxiii) Registration Rights. Neither the filing of the Registration Statements nor the offering or sale of the Securities as contemplated by this Agreement gives rise to any rights for or relating to the registration of any shares of Common Stock or other securities of the Company.

(xxiv) Lock-Up Agreements. Prior to the Closing Date the Company shall have received copies of the executed Lock-Up Agreements, substantially in the form of Exhibit A hereto (the "Lock-Up Agreement") executed by each entity or person listed on Schedule III hereto, and such Lock-Up Agreements shall be in full force and effect on the Closing Date.

(xxv) *Permits.* The Company and each of its Subsidiaries holds, and is operating in compliance in all respects with, all franchises, grants, authorizations, licenses, permits, easements, consents, certificates and orders of any governmental or self regulatory body required for the conduct of its business and all such franchises, grants, authorizations, licenses, permits, easements, consents, certifications and orders are valid and in full force and effect, except where non-compliance would not have a Material Adverse Effect; and the Company and each of its Subsidiaries is in compliance in all respects with all applicable federal, state, local and foreign laws, regulations, orders and decrees, except where non-compliance would not have a Material Adverse Effect.

(xxvi) Good Title to Property. The Company and its Subsidiaries have good and marketable title in fee simple to all real property and good and marketable title to all personal property described in the Registration Statements, in the General Disclosure Package and in the Prospectus as being owned by them other than Intellectual Property, which is covered by <u>Section 2(a)(xxvii)</u> hereof, in each case free and clear of all liens, claims, security interests, other encumbrances or defects except such as are described in the General Disclosure Package, except as would not have a Material Adverse Effect. Any real property held under lease by the Company and its Subsidiaries are held by them under valid, subsisting and enforceable leases with only such exceptions with respect to any particular lease as are not material and do not interfere in any material respect with the use made and proposed to be made of such property by the Company and its Subsidiaries, except as would not have a Material Adverse Effect.

(xxvii) Intellectual Property. To the Company's knowledge, except as would not have a Material Adverse Effect and other than as disclosed in the Registration Statements, General Disclosure Package and the Prospectus, the Company and each of its Subsidiaries owns or possesses all patents, patent applications, trademarks, service marks, tradenames, trademark registrations, service mark registrations, copyrights, licenses, inventions, trade secrets and rights necessary for the conduct of the business of the Company and its Subsidiaries as currently carried on and as described in the Registration Statements, in the General Disclosure Package and in the Prospectus.

(xxviii) *No Violation.* Neither the Company nor any of its Subsidiaries is (a) in violation of its respective charter orby-laws or (b) in breach of or otherwise in default, and no event has occurred which, with notice or lapse of time or both, would constitute such a default in the performance of any material obligation, agreement or condition contained in any bond, debenture, note, indenture, loan agreement or any other material contract, lease or other instrument to which it is subject or by which any of the material property or assets of the Company or any of its Subsidiaries is subject, other than, in the case of clause (b) above, any conflict, breach or violation that would not have a Material Adverse Effect.

(xxix) *Taxes.* Other than would not have a Material Adverse Effect, the Company and its Subsidiaries have timely filed all federal, state, local and foreign income and franchise tax returns required to be filed and are not in default in the payment of any taxes to the extent due which were payable pursuant to said returns or any assessments with respect thereto, other than any which the Company or any of its Subsidiaries is contesting in good faith.

(xxx) *Trading Market; Exchange Act Registration.* Except as disclosed in the Registration Statements, in the General Disclosure Package, and in the Prospectus, the Common Stock is registered pursuant to Section 12(g) of the Exchange Act and is included or approved for inclusion on the Nasdaq Global Market and the Company has taken no action designed to, or likely to have the effect of, terminating the registration of the Common Stock under the Exchange Act or delisting the Common Stock from the Nasdaq Global Market nor has the Company received any notification that the Commission, the Nasdaq Global Market or the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority is contemplating terminating such registration or listing. Except as disclosed in the Registration Statements, in the General Disclosure Package, and in Prospectus, the Company is in compliance in all material respects with the applicable requirements of the Nasdaq Global Market for maintenance of inclusion of the Common Stock thereon. The Company has filed a listing application with the Nasdaq Global Market in respect of the Shares.

(xxxi) *Subsidiaries*. Other than the subsidiaries of the Company listed in <u>Schedule IV</u> hereto (each a "*Subsidiary*" and collectively, the "*Subsidiaries*") and except as otherwise disclosed in the Registration Statements, in the General Disclosure Package and in the Prospectus, the Company, directly or indirectly, owns no capital stock or other equity or ownership or proprietary interest in any corporation, partnership, association, trust or other entity.

(xxxii) Accounting Controls. The Company maintains a system of internal accounting controls that have been designed to provide reasonable assurances that (A) transactions are executed in accordance with management's general or specific authorization; (B) transactions are recorded as necessary to permit preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles and to maintain accountability for assets; (C) access to assets is permitted only in accordance with management's general or specific authorization; and (D) the recorded accountability for assets is compared with existing assets at reasonable intervals and appropriate action

is taken with respect to any differences. Except as described in the Registration Statements, in the General Disclosure Package and in the Prospectus, since the most recent audit of the effectiveness of the Company's internal control over financial reporting, there has been (i) no material weakness in the Company's internal control over financial reporting (whether or not remediated) and (ii) no change in the Company's internal control over financial reporting that has materially affected, or is reasonably likely to materially affect, the Company's internal control over financial reporting.

(xxxiii) Broker's Fee. Other than as contemplated by this Agreement or as otherwise disclosed in the General Disclosure Package and the Prospectus, the Company has not incurred any liability for any finder's or broker's fee or agent's commission in connection with the execution and delivery of this Agreement or the consummation of the transactions contemplated hereby.

(xxxiv) Insurance. The Company carries, or is covered by, insurance in such amounts and covering such risks as is customary for companies engaged in similar businesses in similar industries.

(xxxv) Investment Company. The Company is not and, after giving effect to the offering and sale of the Securities and application of the net proceeds from the offering as set forth in the General Disclosure Package will not be an "investment company," as such term is defined in the Investment Company Act of 1940, as amended.

(xxxvi) Use of Form S-3. The conditions for use of Form S-3, set forth in the General Instructions thereto, including General Instruction I.B.1, have been satisfied.

(xxxvii) Sarbanes-Oxley. The Company is in compliance, in all material respects, with all applicable provisions of the Sarbanes-Oxley Act and the rules and regulations of the Commission thereunder.

(xxxviii) *Disclosure Controls.* The Company has established and maintains "disclosure controls and procedures" (as defined in Rules 13a-15 and 15d-15 under the Exchange Act) and such controls and procedures are effective in ensuring that material information relating to the Company, including its Subsidiaries, is made known to the principal executive officer and the principal financial officer. The Company has utilized such controls and procedures in preparing and evaluating the disclosures in the Registration Statements, in the General Disclosure Package and in the Prospectus.

(xxxix) *No Price Stabilization*. Neither the Company nor any Subsidiary nor, to the Company's knowledge, any of their respective officers, directors, affiliates or controlling persons has taken or will take, directly or indirectly, any action designed to or that might be reasonably expected to cause or result in, or which has constituted or which might reasonably be expected to constitute the stabilization or manipulation of the price of any security of the Company to facilitate the sale or resale of the Securities in violation of applicable law.

(xl) *No Labor Disputes.* No labor problem or dispute with the employees of the Company exists, or, to the Company's knowledge, is threatened or imminent, which would reasonably be expected to result in a Material Adverse Effect. Except as would not have a Material Adverse Effect, the Company is not aware that any key employee or significant group of employees of the Company plans to terminate employment with the Company.

(xli) *Defined Benefit Plans*. Neither the Company nor any of the Subsidiaries has maintained or contributed to a defined benefit plan as defined in Section 3(35) of Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended ("*ERISA*"). No plan maintained or contributed to by the Company that is subject to ERISA (an "*ERISA Plan*") (or any trust created thereunder) has engaged in a "prohibited transaction" within the meaning of Section 406 of ERISA or Section 4975 of the Code that could subject the Company or any of the Subsidiaries to any tax penalty on prohibited transactions and that has not adequately been corrected except as would not have a Material Adverse Effect. Each ERISA Plan is in compliance in all material respects with all reporting, disclosure and other requirements of the Code and ERISA as they relate to such ERISA Plan, except for any noncompliance which would not result in the imposition of a material tax or monetary penalty. With respect to each ERISA Plan that is intended to be "qualified" within the meaning of Section 401(a) of the Code, either (i) a determination letter has been issued by the Internal Revenue Service stating that such ERISA Plan and the attendant trust are qualified thereunder, or (ii) the remedial amendment period under Section 401(b) of the Code with respect to to the establishment of such ERISA Plan has not ended and a determination letter application will be filed with respect to such ERISA Plan prior to the end of such remedial amendment period. Neither the Company nor any of the Subsidiaries has ever completely or partially withdrawn from a "multiemployer plan," as defined in Section 3(37) of ERISA.

(xlii) Compliance with Environmental Laws. The Company and its Subsidiaries (a) are in compliance with any and all applicable foreign, federal, state and local laws, orders, rules, regulations, directives, decrees and judgments relating to the use, treatment, storage and disposal of hazardous or toxic substances or waste and protection of human health and safety or the environment which are applicable to their businesses ("Environmental Laws"), (b) have received and are in compliance with all permits, licenses or other approvals required of them under applicable Environmental Laws to conduct its business; and (c) have not received notice of any actual or potential liability for the investigation or remediation of any disposal or release of hazardous or toxic substances or wastes, pollutants or contaminants, except in the case of subsections (a), (b) and (c) of this Section 2(a)(xlii) as would not, individually or in the aggregate, have a Material Adverse Effect.

(xliii) No Undisclosed Relationships. No relationship, direct or indirect, exists between or among the Company and any of its Subsidiaries on the one hand and the directors, officers, stockholders, customers or suppliers of the Company or any of its Subsidiaries or any of their affiliates on the other hand, which is required to be described in the Registration Statements, in the General Disclosure Package and the Prospectus or a document incorporated by reference therein and which has not been so described.

(xliv) *Forward-Looking Statements*. No forward-looking statements (within the meaning of Section 27A of the Securities Act and Section 21E of the Exchange Act) contained in either the General Disclosure Package or the Prospectus has been made or reaffirmed without a reasonable basis or has been disclosed other than in good faith.

(xlv) *Minute Books*. The minute books of the Company and any of its Subsidiaries, representing all existing records of all meetings and actions of the board of directors (including, Audit, Compensation and Nomination/Corporate Governance Committees) and stockholders of the Company and any of its Subsidiaries (collectively, the "*Corporate Records*") through the date of the latest meeting and action have been made available to the Underwriter or counsel for the Underwriter. All such Corporate Records are substantially complete and accurately reflect, in all material respects, all transactions referred to in such Corporate Records. There are no material transactions, agreements or other actions that have been consummated by the Company or any of the Subsidiaries that are not properly approved and/or recorded in the Corporate Records of the Company and the Subsidiaries.

(xlvi) *Foreign Corrupt Practices*. Neither the Company nor, to the Company's knowledge, any other person associated with or acting on behalf of the Company, including without limitation any director, officer, agent or employee of the Company or its Subsidiaries has, directly or indirectly, while acting on behalf of the Company or its Subsidiaries (i) used any corporate funds for unlawful contributions, gifts, entertainment or other unlawful expenses relating to political activity or failed to disclose fully any contribution in violation of law, (ii) made any payment to any federal or state governmental officer or official, or other person charged with similar public or quasi-public duties, other than payments required or permitted by the laws of the United States or any jurisdiction thereof, (iii) violated or is in violation of any provision of the U.S. Foreign Corrupt Practices Act of 1977, as amended or (iv) made any bribe, rebate, payoff, influence payment, kickback or other unlawful payments.

(xlvii) Statistical or Market-Related Data. Any statistical, industry-related and market-related data included or incorporated by reference in the Registration Statements, a Statutory Prospectus, the General Disclosure Package or the Prospectus, are based on or derived from sources that the Company reasonably and in good faith believes to be reliable and accurate, and such data agree with the sources from which they are derived.

(xlviii) Money Laundering Laws. The operations of the Company and its Subsidiaries are and have been conducted at all times in compliance in all material respects with applicable financial recordkeeping and reporting requirements of the Currency and Foreign Transactions Reporting Act of 1970, as amended, the money laundering statutes of all jurisdictions, the rules and regulations thereunder and any related or similar rules, regulations or guidelines, issued, administered or enforced by any governmental agency (collectively, the "Money Laundering Laws") and no action, suit or proceeding by or before any court or governmental agency, authority or body or any arbitrator involving the Company or any of its Subsidiaries with respect to the Money Laundering Laws is pending, or to the knowledge of the Company, threatened against the Company or any of its Subsidiaries.

(xlix) Audit Committee. The Company's Board of Directors has validly appointed an audit committee whose composition satisfies the requirements of Section 10A-3 of the Exchange Act and the rules and regulations of any trading market (including Rule 5605(c)(2) of the Nasdaq Marketplace Rules) and the Board of Directors and/or the audit committee has adopted a charter that satisfies the requirements of Section 10A-3 of the Exchange Act and the rules and regulations of any trading market (including Rule 5605(c)(1) of the Nasdaq Marketplace Rules).

(1) OFAC. Except as would not have a Material Adverse Effect, neither the Company nor any of its Subsidiaries nor, to the knowledge of the Company, any director, officer, agent, or employee of the Company or any of its Subsidiaries is currently subject to any U.S. sanctions administered by the Office of Foreign Assets Control of the U.S. Treasury Department ("**OFAC**"); and the Company will not directly or indirectly use the proceeds of the offering, or lend, contribute or otherwise make available such proceeds to any Subsidiary, joint venture partner or other person or entity, for the purpose of financing the activities of any person currently subject to any U.S. sanctions administered by OFAC.

(li) *FINRA Matters*. The Company satisfies the pre-October 21, 1992 eligibility requirements for the use of a registration statement on Form S-3 in connection with the offering of the Securities, including, without limitation: (i) having a non-affiliate, public common equity float of at least \$100 million with 60 days prior to the date of this Agreement and annual trading volume of at least three million shares for the continuous 12-month period ended on the date of this Agreement and (ii) having been subject to the Exchange Act reporting requirements for a period of at least 36 months immediately preceding the date of this Agreement.

(lii) Shareholder Approval. No approval of the shareholders of the Company under the rules and regulations of any trading market (including Rule 5635 of the Nasdaq Marketplace Rules) is required for the Company to issue and deliver the Securities to the Underwriter.

(b) Any certificate signed by any officer of the Company and delivered hereunder to the Underwriter or to counsel for the Underwriter in connection with the offering shall be deemed a representation and warranty by the Company to the Underwriter as to the matters covered thereby.

3. Conditions of the Underwriter's Obligations. The obligation of the Underwriter to purchase the Securities is subject to each of the following terms and conditions:

(a) Notification that each of the Registration Statements has become effective shall have been received by the Underwriter and the Prospectus shall have been timely filed with the Commission in accordance with Section 4(a) of this Agreement and any material required to be filed by the Company pursuant to Rule 433(d) of the Rules shall have been timely filed with the Commission in accordance with such rule.

(b) No order preventing or suspending the use of any Preliminary Prospectus, the Prospectus or any "free writing prospectus" (as defined in Rule 405 of the Rules), shall have been or shall be in effect and no order suspending the effectiveness of either of the Registration Statements shall be in effect and no proceedings for such purpose shall be pending before or, to the knowledge of the Company, threatened by the Commission, and any requests for additional information on the part of the Commission (to be included in the Registration Statements or the Prospectus or otherwise) shall have been complied with to the satisfaction of the Commission and the Underwriter. If the Company has elected to rely upon Rule 430A, Rule 430A information previously omitted from the effective Registration Statements pursuant to Rule 430A shall have been transmitted to the Commission for filing pursuant to Rule 424(b) within the prescribed time period and the Company shall have provided evidence satisfactory to the Underwriter of such timely filing, or a post-effective amendment providing such information shall have been promptly filed and declared effective in accordance with the requirements of Rule 430A.

(c) The representations and warranties of the Company contained in this Agreement and in the certificates delivered pursuant to <u>Section 3(d)</u> shall be true and correct when made and on and as of the Closing Date as if made on such date. The Company shall have performed all covenants and agreements and satisfied all the conditions contained in this Agreement required to be performed or satisfied by them at or before such Closing Date.

(d) The Underwriter shall have received on the Closing Date a certificate, addressed to the Underwriter and dated such Closing Date, of the chief executive or chief operating officer and the chief financial officer or chief accounting officer of the Company to the effect that: (i) the representations, warranties and agreements of the Company in this Agreement were true and correct when made and are true and correct as of such Closing Date; (ii) the Company has performed all covenants and agreements and satisfied all conditions contained herein required to be performed or satisfied by the Company; (iii) in their opinion (A) as of the Effective Date, the Registration Statements and Prospectus did not include, and as of the Applicable Time, neither (i) the General Disclosure Package, nor (ii) any individual Issuer Free Writing Prospectus, when considered together with the General Disclosure Package, included, any untrue statement of a material fact and did not omit to state a material fact required to be stated therein or necessary to make the statements therein, in light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading, and (B) since the Effective Date, no event has occurred which should have been set forth in a supplement or otherwise required an amendment to the Registration Statements, the Statutory Prospectus or the Prospectus; and (iv) no stop order suspending the effectiveness of the Registration Statements has been issued and, to their knowledge, no proceedings for that purpose have been instituted or are pending under the Securities Act.

(e) The Underwriter shall have received: (i) simultaneously with the execution of this Agreement a signed letter from the Auditor addressed to the Underwriter and dated the date of this Agreement, in form and substance reasonably satisfactory to the Representative, containing statements and information of the type ordinarily included in

accountants' "comfort letters" to underwriters with respect to the financial statements and certain financial information contained in the Registration Statements and the General Disclosure Package, and (ii) on the Closing Date, a signed letter from the Auditor addressed to the Underwriter and dated the date of such Closing Date, in form and substance reasonably satisfactory to the Underwriter containing statements and information of the type ordinarily included in accountants' "comfort letters" to underwriters with respect to the financial statements and certain financial information contained in the Registration Statements and the Prospectus.

(f) The Underwriter shall have received on the Closing Date from Ropes & Gray LLP, counsel for the Company, an opinion and written statement, addressed to the Underwriter and dated such Closing Date, in form and substance as is set forth on <u>Exhibit B</u> attached hereto.

(g) The Underwriter shall have received on the Closing Date from Goodwin Procter LLP, counsel for the Underwriter, an opinion and written statement, addressed to the Representative and dated such Closing Date, with respect to the validity of the Securities, the Registration Statements, the General Disclosure Package, the Prospectus and other related matters as the Underwriter reasonably may request, and such counsel shall have received such papers and information as they request to enable them to pass upon such matters.

(h) All proceedings taken in connection with the sale of the Securities as herein contemplated shall be reasonably satisfactory in form and substance to the Underwriter and counsel for the Underwriter.

(i) The Underwriter shall have received copies of the Lock-Up Agreements executed by each entity or person listed on Schedule III hereto.

(j) The Shares and the Warrant Shares shall have been approved for listing on the Nasdaq Global Market, subject only to official notice of issuance.

(k) The Underwriter shall be reasonably satisfied that since the respective dates as of which information is given in the General Disclosure Package and the Prospectus, (i) except as set forth or contemplated by the Registration Statements, the Statutory Prospectus, the General Disclosure Package or the Prospectus, there shall not have been any material change in the capital stock of the Company (other than as a result or the exercise of outstanding stock options) or any material change in the indebtedness (other than in the ordinary course of business) of the Company, (ii) except as set forth or contemplated by the Registration Statements, the Statutory Prospectus, the General Disclosure Package or the Prospectus, no material or written agreement or other transaction shall have been entered into by the Company that is not in the ordinary course of business or that could reasonably be expected to result in a material reduction in the future earnings of the Company, (ii) except as set forth or contemplated by the Registration Statements, the Statutory Prospectus, the General Disclosure Package or the property of the Company shall have been sustained that had or would reasonably be expected to have a Material Adverse Effect, (iv) except as set forth or contemplated by the Registration Statements, the Statutory Prospectus, the General Disclosure Package or the Prospectus, no legal or governmental action, suit or proceeding affecting the Company or any of its properties that is

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material to the Company or that affects or could reasonably be expected to affect the transactions contemplated by this Agreement shall have been instituted or threatened and (v) except as set forth or contemplated by the Registration Statements, the Statutory Prospectus, the General Disclosure Package or the Prospectus, there shall not have been any material adverse change in the assets, properties, financial condition, or in the results of operations, business affairs or business prospects of the Company or its Subsidiaries considered as a whole that makes it impractical or inadvisable in the Underwriter's judgment to proceed with the purchase or offering of the Securities as contemplated hereby.

(1) On the Closing Date, the Company shall have furnished to the Underwriter a Secretary's Certificate of the Company.

(m) On the Closing Date, the Company shall have furnished to the Underwriter a Certificate of the Chief Financial Officer of the Company.

(n) The Company shall have furnished or caused to be furnished to the Underwriter such further certificates or documents as the Underwriter shall have reasonably requested.

4. Covenants and other Agreements of the Company and the Underwriter.

(a) The Company covenants and agrees as follows:

(i) The Company will use its best efforts to cause the Registration Statements, if not effective at the time of execution of this Agreement, and any amendments thereto, to become effective as promptly as possible. The Company shall prepare the Prospectus in a form approved by the Underwriter and file such Prospectus pursuant to Rule 424(b) under the Securities Act not later than the Commission's close of business on the second business day following the execution and delivery of this Agreement, or, if applicable, such earlier time as may be required by the Rules. The Company will file with the Commission all Issuer Free Writing Prospectuses in the time and manner required under Rules 433(d) or 163(b)(2), as the case may be.

(ii) The Company shall promptly advise the Underwriter in writing (A) when any post-effective amendment to the Registration Statements shall have become effective or any supplement to the Prospectus shall have been filed, (B) of any request by the Commission for any amendment of the Registration Statements or the Prospectus or for any additional information, (C) of the issuance by the Commission of any stop order suspending the effectiveness of the Registration Statements or of any order preventing or suspending the use of any preliminary prospectus or any "free writing prospectus", as defined in Rule 405 of the Rules, or the institution or threatening of any proceeding for that purpose and (D) of the receipt by the Company of any notification with respect to the suspension of the qualification of the Securities for sale in any jurisdiction or the initiation or threatening of any proceeding for such purpose. The Company shall not file any amendment of the Registration Statements or supplement to the Prospectus or any document incorporated by reference in the Registration Statements or any Issuer Free Writing Prospectus unless the Company has furnished the Underwriter a copy for its

review prior to filing and shall not file any such proposed amendment or supplement to which the Underwriter reasonably objects. The Company shall use its best efforts to obtain as soon as possible the withdrawal of any stop order. (iii) If, at any time when a prospectus relating to the Securities (or, in lieu thereof, the notice referred to in Rule 173(a) of the Rules) is required to be delivered under the Securities Act and the Rules, any event occurs as a result of which the Prospectus as then amended or supplemented includes any untrue statement of a material fact or omits to state any material fact necessary to make the statements therein in the light of the circumstances under which they were made not misleading, or if it shall be necessary to amend or supplement the Prospectus to comply with the Securities Act or the Rules, the Company promptly shall prepare and file with the Commission, subject to the second sentence of paragraph (ii) of this <u>Section 4(a)</u>, an amendment or supplement which shall correct such statement or omission or an amendment which shall effect such compliance.

In addition, the provisions of <u>Sections 4(b)</u>, <u>5</u>, <u>6</u> and <u>7</u> shall survive the termination or cancellation of this Agreement.

This Agreement has been and is made for the benefit of the Underwriter, the Company and their respective successors and assigns, and, to the extent expressed herein, for the benefit of persons controlling the Underwriter, or the Company, and directors and officers of the Company, and their respective successors and assigns, and no other person shall acquire or have any right under or by virtue of this Agreement. The term "successors and assigns" shall not include any purchaser of Securities from the Underwriter merely because of such purchase.

In consideration of your agreement to enter into the Underwriting Agreement and to proceed with the Public Offering of the Securities, and for other good and valuable consideration receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the undersigned hereby agrees for the benefit of the Company and you that, without your prior written consent, the undersigned will not, during the period ending 90 days (the "*Lock-Up Period*") after the date of the prospectus relating to the Public Offering (the "*Prospectus*"), directly or indirectly (1) offer, pledge, assign, encumber, announce the intention to sell, sell, contract to sell, sell any option or contract to purchase, purchase any option or contract to sell, grant any option, right or warrant to purchase, or otherwise transfer or dispose of, any shares of Common Stock or any securities convertible into or exercisable or exchangeable for Common Stock owned either of record or beneficially (as defined in the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended) by the undersigned on the date hereof or hereafter acquired or (2) enter into any swap or other agreement that transfers, in whole or in part, any of the economic consequences of ownership of the Common Stock, whether any such transaction described in clause (1) or (2) above is to be settled by delivery of Common Stock or such other securities, in cash or otherwise, or publicly announce an intention to do any of the foregoing. In addition, the undersigned agrees that, without your prior written consent, it will not, during the period ending 90 days after the date of the Prospectus, make any demand for or exercise any right with respect to, the registration of any shares of Common Stock or any security convertible into or exercisable or exchangeable for Common Stock. The foregoing shall not apply to (x) Common Stock to be transferred as a gift or gifts (provided that any donee thereof agrees in writing to be bound by the terms hereof), and (y) sales under any 10b-5 plan.

In furtherance of the foregoing, the Company, and any duly appointed transfer agent for the registration or transfer of the securities described herein, are hereby authorized to decline to make any transfer of securities if such transfer would constitute a violation or breach of this Letter Agreement.

The undersigned hereby represents and warrants that the undersigned has full power and authority to enter into this Letter Agreement. All authority herein conferred or agreed to be conferred and any obligations of the undersigned shall be binding upon the successors, assigns, heirs or personal representatives of the undersigned.

The undersigned understands that, if the Underwriting Agreement does not become effective, or if the Underwriting Agreement (other than the provisions thereof which survive termination) shall terminate or be terminated prior to payment for and delivery of the Common Stock to be sold thereunder, the undersigned shall be released form all obligations under this Letter Agreement.

The undersigned, whether or not participating in the Public Offering, understands that you are entering into the Underwriting Agreement and proceeding with the Public Offering in reliance upon this Letter Agreement.

WARRANT AGREEMENT

THIS WARRANT AGREEMENT is dated March 18, 2014, between MicroVision, Inc., a Delaware corporation (the "Company"), and MicroVision, Inc., acting as warrant agent (the "Warrant Agent").

WHEREAS, the Company proposes to issue warrants (collectively, with any Additional Warrants, the "Warrants") to acquire up to 2,148,000 shares, subject to adjustment as provided herein, of common stock, \$.001 par value ("Common Stock"), of the Company (collectively, the "Warrant Shares");

WHEREAS, each Warrant shall represent the right to purchase from the Company, at an initial price of \$2.47 per share (the "Exercise Price"), the number of shares specified on the certificates evidencing the Warrants (the "Warrant Certificates"); and

WHEREAS, MicroVision, Inc. is willing to serve as the Warrant Agent in connection with the issuance of Warrant Certificates and the other matters as provided herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and for the purpose of defining the terms and provisions of the Warrants and the respective rights and obligations thereunder of the Company, the Warrant Agent and the record holders from time to time of the Warrants (the "Holders"), the parties hereby agree as follows:

1. Definitions. For the purposes hereof, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

"Business Day" means any day except Saturday, Sunday and any day which shall be a federal legal holiday in the United States or a day on which banking institutions in The City of New York are authorized or required by law or other government action to close.

"Date of Exercise" means the date on which the Holder shall have delivered to the Company (ii) the Form of Election to Purchase attached thereto (with the Warrant Exercise Log attached to it), appropriately completed and duly signed, provided that, (i) the Warrant Certificate shall have been delivered within three Business Days of such date, and (ii) in the case of a Cash Exercise, payment of the Exercise Price in accordance with Section 9 for the number of Warrant Shares so indicated by the Holder to be purchased is paid within one Business Day of such date.

"Exchange Act" means the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended, and the rules and regulations of the Securities and Exchange Commission promulgated thereunder.

"Expiration Date" means the date 5 years after the Initial Issuance Date.

"Initial Issuance Date" means March 18, 2014.

"Market Price" of a share of Common Stock on any date shall mean, (i) if the shares of Common Stock are traded on the Nasdaq Global Market, the last closing bid price (which, for the avoidance of doubt, shall mean the closing bid price on the prior Trading Day if the Form of Election to Purchase is received prior to 4:00 p.m. ET on the Date of Exercise); (ii) if the shares of Common Stock are no longer quoted on Nasdaq and are listed on any other

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national securities exchange, the last sale price of the Common Stock reported by such exchange on that date; (iii) if the shares of Common Stock are not quoted on any such market or listed on any such exchange and the shares of Common Stock are traded in the over-the-counter market, the last price reported on such day by the OTC Bulletin Board; (iv) if the shares of Common Stock are not quoted on any such market, listed on any such exchange or quoted on the OTC Bulletin Board; (iv) if the shares of Common Stock are not quoted on any such market, listed on any such exchange or quoted on the OTC Bulletin Board, then the last price quoted on such day in the over-the-counter market as reported by the National Quotation Bureau Incorporated (or any similar organization or agency succeeding its functions of reporting prices); or (v) if none of clauses (i)-(iv) are applicable, then as determined, in good faith, by the Board of Directors of the Company.

"Person" means a corporation, association, partnership, limited liability corporation, organization, business, individual, government or political subdivision thereof or governmental agency.

"Trading Day" means (i) a day on which the shares of Common Stock are traded on the Nasdaq Global Market, Nasdaq Capital Market, New York Stock Exchange or American Stock Exchange on which the shares of Common Stock are then listed or quoted, or (ii) if the shares of Common Stock are not listed on any such exchange or market, a day on which the shares of Common Stock are traded in the over-the-counter market, as reported by the OTC Bulletin Board, or (iii) if the shares of Common Stock are not quoted on the OTC Bulletin Board, a day on which the shares of Common Stock are quoted in the over-the-counter market as reported by the National Quotation Bureau Incorporated (or any similar organization or agency succeeding its functions of reporting prices); provided, that in the event that the shares of Common Stock are not listed or quoted as set forth in clause (i), (ii) or (iii) hereof, then Trading Day shall mean a Business Day.

2. Form of Warrant Certificates.

(a) The Warrant Certificates shall be issued in registered form only as definitive Warrant Certificates and shall be substantially in the form attached hereto a<u>Exhibit A</u>, shall be dated the date of issuance thereof (whether upon initial issuance, register of transfer, exchange or replacement) and shall bear such legends and endorsements typed, stamped, printed, lithographed or engraved thereon as the Company may deem appropriate and as are not inconsistent with the provisions of this Agreement. Warrant Certificates evidencing Warrants to purchase the number of shares of Common Stock specified on each Warrant Certificate shall be signed by, or bear the facsimile signature of, the Chairman of the Board, Chief Executive Officer, President, any Vice President, Treasurer or Secretary of the Company. In the event the person whose facsimile signature has been placed upon any Warrant Certificate shall have ceased to serve in the capacity in which such person signed the Warrant Certificate before such Warrant Certificate is issued, it may be issued with the same effect as if he or she had not ceased to be such at the date of issuance.

(b) *Effect of Countersignature*. Unless and until countersigned by the Warrant Agent pursuant to this Agreement, a Warrant Certificate shall be invalid and of no effect and may not be exercised by the holder thereof. Such signature by the Warrant Agent upon any Warrant Certificate executed by the Company shall be conclusive evidence that such Warrant Certificate has been duly issued under the terms of this Agreement.

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(c) *Warrant Register*. The Warrant Agent shall maintain books (the "Warrant Register"), for the registration of original issuance and the registration of transfer of Warrant Certificates. Upon the initial issuance of the Warrant Certificates, the Warrant Agent shall issue and register the Warrant Certificates in the names of the respective holders thereof in such denominations and otherwise in accordance with instructions delivered to the Warrant Agent by the Company. The Company and the Warrant Agent may deem and treat the registered Holder of each Warrant Certificate as the absolute owner of the Warrants represented thereby for the purpose of any exercise thereof or any distribution to the Holder, and for all other purposes, absent actual notice to the contrary.

(d) *Registration of Transfers.* The Warrant Agent shall register the transfer of any portion of a Warrant Certificate in the Warrant Register, upon surrender of the Warrant Certificate, with the Form of Assignment attached thereto duly completed and signed, to the Company at its address specified herein. Upon any such registration or transfer, a new Warrant Certificate substantially in the form attached hereto as <u>Exhibit A</u> (any such new Warrant Certificate, a "New Warrant Certificate"), evidencing the portion of the Warrant Certificate so transferred shall be issued to the transferee and a New Warrant Certificate evidencing the remaining portion of the Warrant Certificate not so transferred, if any, shall be issued to the transferring Holder. The delivery of the New Warrant Certificate by the Company to the transferee thereof shall be deemed to constitute acceptance by such transferee of all of the rights and obligations of a holder of a Warrant Certificate.

3. *Term of Warrants.* Warrants shall be exercisable by the registered Holder at any time and from time to time on or after the calendar day that is six months from the Initial Issuance Date to and including the Expiration Date. At 5:00 p.m., New York time on the Expiration Date, any portion of a Warrant not exercised prior thereto shall be and become void and of no value.

4. Exercise of Warrants and Delivery of Warrant Shares.

(a) If, and only if, an effective registration statement is then available for the issuance of the Warrant Shares, a registered Holder may exercise the Warrants through a cash exercise (a "Cash Exercise") or, if an effective registration statement is not then available for the issuance of the Warrant Shares, through a cashless exercise (a "Cashless Exercise") pursuant to Section 4(b) below. If an effective registration statement is available for the issuance of the warrants, the warrants may only be exercised through a cash exercise.

(b) The Holder may effect a Cashless Exercise by surrendering Warrant Certificates to the Warrant Agent and noting on the Form of Election to Purchase that the Holder wishes to effect a Cashless Exercise, upon which the Company shall issue, or cause to be issued, to the Holder the number of Warrant Shares determined as follows:

X = Y x (A-B)/A

where:

X = the number of Warrant Shares to be issued to the Holder;

Y = the number of Warrant Shares with respect to which the Warrant Certificates are being exercised;

A = the Market Price as of the Date of Exercise; and

B = the Exercise Price.

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(c) At such times, and upon such representations and agreements, if applicable, upon surrender of a Warrant Certificate and delivery of the Form of Election to Purchase (with the Warrant Shares Exercise Log attached) to the Warrant Agent at its address for notice set forth in Section 13, and, in the case of a Cash Exercise, upon payment of the Exercise Price multiplied by the number of Warrant Shares that the Holder intends to purchase thereunder (which must be a whole number) in accordance with Section 9 (the "Aggregate Exercise Price"), the Company shall promptly issue and deliver to the Holder a certificate for the Warrant Shares issuable upon such exercise. Any Person so designated by the Holder to receive Warrant Shares shall be deemed to have become holder of record of such Warrant Shares as of the Date of Exercise of the relevant Warrant Certificate. For so long as there is a then effective registration statement covering the issuance of the Warrant Shares or if a Holder effects a Cashless Exercise, the Warrant Shares shall be deemed to have become holder, if available, use commercially reasonable efforts to deliver Warrant Shares shall be issued free of all restrictive legends, and the Company shall, upon request of the Holder, if available, use commercially reasonable efforts to deliver Warrant Shares issuable upon exercise of the relevant Warrant Certificate are purchased on such Date of Exercise, then the Company will execute and deliver to the Holder or its assigns a New Warrant Certificate (dated the date thereof) evidencing the unexercised portion of the relevant Warrant Certificate.

(d) A Holder shall not have the right to exercise any portion of the Warrants, pursuant to Section 4 or otherwise, to the extent that after giving effect to such issuance after exercise as set forth on the applicable Form of Election to Purchase, such Holder (together with such Holder's Affiliates (as defined in Rule 13e-3 of the Rules promulgated under the Exchange Act), and any other Persons acting as a group together with such Holder or any of such Holder's Affiliates), would beneficially own in excess of the Beneficial Ownership Limitation (as defined below). For purposes of the foregoing sentence, the number of shares of Common Stock beneficially owned by a Holder and its Affiliates shall include the number of shares of Common Stock issuable upon exercise of the Warrants with respect to which such determination is being made, but shall exclude the number of shares of Common Stock which would be issuable upon (i) exercise of the remaining, nonexercised portion of the Warrants beneficially owned by such Holder or any of its Affiliates and (ii) exercise or conversion of the unexercised or nonconverted portion of any other securities of the Company exercisable for or convertible into Common Stock that are subject to a limitation on conversion or exercise analogous to the limitation contained herein beneficially owned by such Holder or any of its Affiliates. Except as set forth in the preceding sentence, for purposes of this Section 4(d), beneficial ownership shall be calculated in accordance with Section 13(d) of the Exchange Act and each Holder is solely responsible for any schedules required to be filed in accordance therewith. To the extent that the limitation contained in this Section 4(d) applies, the determination of whether the Warrants owned by a Holder are exercisable (in relation to other securities owned by such Holder together with its Affiliates) and of which portion of the Warrants owned by such Holder are exercisable (in relation to other securities owned by such Holder together with its Affilia

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Election to Purchase shall be deemed to be such Holder's determination of whether the Warrants owned by such Holder are exercisable (in relation to other securities owned by such Holder together with any of its Affiliates) and of which portion of such Warrants are exercisable, in each case subject to the Beneficial Ownership Limitation, and the Company shall have no obligation to verify or confirm the accuracy of such determination. In addition, a determination as to any group status as contemplated above shall be determined in accordance with Section 13(d) of the Exchange Act and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder. For purposes of this Section 4(d), in determining the number of outstanding shares of Common Stock, a Holder may rely on the number of outstanding shares of Common Stock as reflected in (A) the Company's most recent periodic or annual report filed with the Commission, as the case may be, (B) a more recent public announcement by the Company or (C) a more recent written notice by the Company setting forth the number of shares of Common Stock outstanding. Upon the written or oral request of a Holder, the Company shall within three Trading Days confirm orally and in writing to the Holder the number of shares of Common Stock then outstanding. In any case, the number of outstanding shares of Common Stock shall be determined after giving effect to the conversion or exercise of securities of the Company, including the Warrants, by the Holder or its Affiliates since the date as of which such number of outstanding shares of Common Stock was reported. The "Beneficial Ownership Limitation" for a Holder shall be 4.99% of the number of shares of the Common Stock outstanding immediately after giving effect to the issuance of shares of Common Stock issuable upon exercise of the Warrants owned by such Holder. A Holder, upon not less than 61 days' prior notice to the Company, may increase or decrease the Beneficial Ownership Limitation provisions of this Section 4(d), but may not increase the Beneficial Ownership Limitation to above 19.99% in any event. Any such increase or decrease will not be effective until the 61st day after such notice is delivered to the Company. The provisions of this paragraph shall be construed and implemented in a manner otherwise than in strict conformity with the terms of this Section 4(d) to correct this paragraph (or any portion hereof) which may be defective or inconsistent with the intended Beneficial Ownership Limitation herein contained or to make changes or supplements necessary or desirable to properly give effect to such limitation. The limitations contained in this paragraph shall apply to a successor holder of the Warrants.

5. Charges, Taxes and Expenses. Issuance and delivery of certificates for Warrant Shares shall be made without charge to the Holder for any issue or transfer tax, or transfer agent fee in respect of the issuance of such certificates, all of which taxes shall be paid by the Company; *provided*, however, that the Company shall not be obligated to pay any tax which may be payable in respect of any transfer involved in the registration of any certificates for Warrant Shares or Warrants in a name other than that of the Holder. The Holder shall be responsible for all other tax liabilities that may arise as a result of holding or transferring any Warrant Certificate or receiving Warrant Shares upon exercise thereof.

6. Replacement of Warrant Certificate. If any Warrant Certificate is mutilated, lost, stolen or destroyed, the Company shall issue or cause to be issued in exchange and substitution for and upon cancellation thereof, or in lieu of and substitution for such Warrant Certificate, a New Warrant Certificate, but only upon receipt of evidence reasonably satisfactory to the Company of such loss, theft or destruction and customary and reasonable indemnity, if requested. Applicants for a New Warrant Certificate under such circumstances shall also comply with such other reasonable regulations and procedures and pay such other reasonable third-party costs as the Company may prescribe.

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7. Reservation of Warrant Shares. The Company covenants that it will at all times reserve and keep available out of its authorized but unissued and otherwise unreserved Common Stock, solely for the purpose of enabling it to issue Warrant Shares upon exercise of all outstanding Warrants as herein provided, the number of Warrant Shares which are then issuable and deliverable upon the exercise of all outstanding Warrants (taking into account the adjustments and restrictions of Section 8). The Company covenants that all Warrant Shares so issuable and deliverable shall, upon issuance and the payment of the applicable Exercise Price in accordance with the terms hereof, be duly and validly authorized and issued, and be fully paid and nonassessable.

8. Certain Adjustments. The Exercise Price and number of Warrant Shares issuable upon exercise of each Warrant then outstanding are subject to adjustment from time to time as set forth in this Section 8.

(a) *Stock Dividends and Splits.* If the Company, (i) pays a stock dividend on its Common Stock, (ii) subdivides outstanding shares of Common Stock into a greater number of shares, or (iii) combines outstanding shares of Common Stock into a lesser number of shares, then in each such case the Exercise Price shall be multiplied by a fraction of which the numerator shall be the number of shares of Common Stock outstanding immediately before such event and of which the denominator shall be the number of shares of Common Stock outstanding immediately after such event. Any adjustment made pursuant to clause (i) of this paragraph shall become effective immediately after the record date for the determination of shareholders entitled to receive such dividend, and any adjustment pursuant to clause (ii) or (iii) of this paragraph shall become effective immediately after the effective date of such subdivision or combination.

(b) *Extraordinary Transactions*. If, (i) the Company effects any merger or consolidation of the Company with or into another Person, (ii) the Company effects any sale of all or substantially all of its assets in one or a series of related transactions, (iii) any tender offer or exchange offer by the Company is completed pursuant to which holders of Common Stock are permitted to tender or exchange their shares for other securities, cash or property, or (iv) the Company effects any reclassification of the Common Stock or any compulsory share exchange pursuant to which the Common Stock is effectively converted into or exchanged for other securities, cash or property (in any such case, an "Extraordinary Transaction"), then each Holder's Warrants will become the right thereafter to receive, upon exercise of his or her Warrants, the same amount and kind of securities, cash or property as such Holder would have been entitled to receive upon the occurrence of such Extraordinary Transaction if it had been, immediately prior to such Extraordinary Transaction, the holder of the number of Warrant Shares then issuable upon exercise in full of the relevant Warrant (the "Alternate Consideration") in lieu of Common Stock. The aggregate Exercise Price for each Warrant will not be affected by any such Extraordinary Transaction, but the Company shall apportion such aggregate Exercise Price among the Alternate Consideration in a reasonable manner reflecting the relative value of any different components of the Alternate Consideration. If holders of Common Stock are given any choice as to the excurties, cash or property to be received in a Extraordinary Transaction, then each Holder, to the extent practicable, shall be given the same choice as to the Alternate Consideration in receives upon any exercise of his or her Warrant following such Extraordinary

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Transaction. In addition, at the request of each Holder, upon surrender of such Holder's Warrant, any successor to the Company or surviving entity in such Extraordinary Transaction shall issue to such Holder a new warrant consistent with the foregoing provisions and evidencing the Holder's right to purchase the Alternate Consideration for the aggregate Exercise Price upon exercise thereof. Each Warrant (or any such replacement security) will be similarly adjusted upon any subsequent transaction analogous to a Extraordinary Transaction. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, in the event of an Extraordinary Transaction other than one in which a Successor Entity (as defined below) that is a publicly traded corporation whose stock is quoted or listed for trading on an Eligible Market (as defined below) assumes this Warrant such that the Warrant shall be exercisable for the publicly traded Common Stock of such Successor Entity, the Company or any Successor Entity shall, at the Holder's option, exercisable at any time concurrently with, or within 30 days after, the consummation of the Extraordinary Transaction, purchase this Warrant from the Holder by paying to the Holder an amount of cash equal to the Black Scholes Value (as defined below) of the remaining unexercised portion of this Warrant on the date of the consummation of such Extraordinary Transaction. "As used herein, "Black Scholes Value" means the value of this Warrant based on the Black and Scholes Option Pricing Model obtained using E*Trade Equity Edge determined as of the day of consummation of the applicable Extraordinary Transaction for pricing purposes and reflecting (A) a risk-free interest rate corresponding to the U.S. Treasury rate for a period equal to the time between the date of the closing of the applicable Extraordinary Transaction and the Expiration Date, (B) an expected volatility equal to the 180-day volatility obtained using E*Trade Equity Edge as of the Trading Day immediately following the public announcement of the applicable Extraordinary Transaction, (C) the underlying price per share used in such calculation shall be the sum of the price per share being offered in cash, if any, plus the value of any non-cash consideration, if any, being offered in such Extraordinary Transaction and (D) a remaining option time equal to the time between the date of the closing of the applicable Extraordinary Transaction and the Expiration Date. For purposes of the foregoing, the value of any non-cash consideration in any Extraordinary Transaction will be determined in good faith by the Board of Directors of the Company or Successor Entity, (1) "Successor Entity" means the Person (as defined below) (or, if so elected by the Holder, the Parent Entity (as defined below)) formed by, resulting from or surviving any Extraordinary Transaction or the Person (or, if so elected by the Holder, the Parent Entity) with which such Extraordinary Transaction shall have been entered into, (2) "Eligible Market" means the NYSE Amex, The NASDAQ Capital Market, The NASDAQ Global Market, The NASDAQ Global Select Market, the New York Stock Exchange or the OTC Bulletin Board (or any successors to any of the foregoing), (3) "Parent Entity" of a Person means an entity that, directly or indirectly, controls the applicable Person and whose common stock or equivalent equity security is quoted or listed on an Eligible Market, or, if there is more than one such Person or Parent Entity, the Person or Parent Entity with the largest public market capitalization as of the date of consummation of the Extraordinary Transaction.

(c) *Number of Warrant Shares*. Simultaneously with any adjustment to the Exercise Price pursuant to paragraph (a) of this Section, the number of Warrant Shares that may be purchased upon exercise of each Warrant shall be increased or decreased proportionately, as the case may be, so that after such adjustment the aggregate Exercise Price payable hereunder for the adjusted number of Warrant Shares shall be the same as the aggregate Exercise Price in effect immediately prior to such adjustment.

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(d) Calculations. All calculations under this Section 8 shall be made to the nearest cent or the nearest 1/100th of a share, as applicable.

(e) *Notice of Adjustments*. Upon the occurrence of each adjustment pursuant to this Section 8, the Company at its expense will promptly calculate such adjustment in accordance with the terms of this Agreement and prepare a certificate setting forth such adjustment, including a statement of the adjusted Exercise Price and adjusted number of Warrant Shares or type of Alternate Consideration issuable upon exercise of each Warrant (as applicable), describing the transactions giving rise to such adjustments and showing in detail the facts upon which such adjustment is based. The Company will promptly deliver to each Holder who makes a request in writing and to the Warrant Agent, a copy of each such certificate.
